Procedural Sedation in Dental Practice – Essential Principles Revisited

Description: This presentation will highlight essential scientific principles for the safe and effective use of moderate sedation in clinical practice. Emphasis is placed on drug regimens having proven safety and efficacy in controlling procedural apprehension. Principles of appropriate patient monitoring along with the recognition and management of sedation-related complications will also be addressed.

Topics:

- Sedation in Perspective
- Pharmacological considerations
- Patient Monitoring
- Complications

Objectives:

1. Characterize minimal, moderate and deep sedation, and distinguish these from general anesthesia.
2. Describe the appropriate use of various drug classes useful for providing sedation, including differences in single drug versus multiple drug regimens.
3. Describe appropriate monitoring of perfusion, ventilation and oxygenation
4. Describe recognition and management of related complications.

Achieving Predictable Stability with Esthetic Dental Implant Therapy. Techniques for Periodontists to Enhance Outcomes and Build their Implant Practices

Dental implant therapy has been a major component of periodontal practices for over 2 decades. The unique post-graduate training in surgery, regeneration and knowledge of wound healing makes the periodontist best-suited for this discipline. Understanding of physiologic changes that occur after teeth are extracted has changed the way treatment is performed. Combining minimally-invasive techniques with regenerative therapy can counter much of the negative dimensional changes that can lead to esthetic failures.

The use of allogeneic and xenograft biomaterials can negate the need for secondary donor sites and reduce morbidity. This can also result in esthetically-pleasing results that can be maintained for years. Techniques such as the Dermal Apron Technique (DAT) and the Subperiosteal Tunneling Technique (SPTI) eliminate the need to harvest autogenous soft tissue grafts and are proven to augment the hard and soft tissues, which remain stable years after therapy. They also increase the thickness of the supracrestal soft tissues, stabilizing bone levels and masking the shadows caused by abutments and frameworks. Clinical studies validating this techniques, as well as their indications and limitations, will be discussed, with an emphasis on private practice, where these procedures are performed regularly.

The technique of creating screw-retained, provisional restorations, for the periodontist will also be presented. This can enhance case acceptance and grow the referral base for periodontists who perform this step. Methodology and use of appropriate materials will be presented.

Outline:

1. Discuss the physiologic changes that occur following extractions.
2. Present the rationale for augmentation around immediate and delayed implants.
3. Demonstrate two novel techniques, best-suited for periodontists to perform, to enhance lasting, esthetic and healthy outcomes.
4. Present the technique of fabrication screw-retained, provisional restorations in the periodontal office.
