Meet Our Speakers...

Dr. Alfonso Piñeyro

Dr. Alfonso Piñeyro received his dental degree from the Universidad Autonoma de Guadalajara. He then completed a two-year advanced education in general dentistry before completing his specialist training in prosthodontics at the University of Rochester Eastman Dental Center.

He is currently an affiliate instructor at the Department of Restorative Dentistry at the University of Washington. He is a past president of the esteemed Washington State Society of Prosthodontists and is also a member of the American College of Prosthodontists and the American Prosthodontics Society.

Dr. Piñeyro has authored several publications in peer reviewed dental journals and chapters in textbooks. He is currently involved in research focusing on dental implants and has developed a set of unique instruments used for implant hygiene and maintenance. Dr. Piñeyro practices full time in the Seattle, Washington area, in a practice limited to fixed implant prosthodontics.

He has lectured both nationally and internationally and has presented over 300 lectures for multiple dental study clubs and dental associations. He has been invited to speak to large national dental symposiums which include: Seattle Study Club Symposium, American Academy of Periodontology, American Academy of Implant Dentistry, American Academy of Fixed Prosthodontics, Academy of Osseointegration, American College of Prosthodontists, Academy of LDS Dentists, and The 12th International Symposium on Periodontics and Restorative Dentistry.

Dr. Kenneth Kornman is an Adjunct Professor in the Department of Periodontics and Oral Medicine at the University of Michigan School of Dentistry, Editor of the Journal of Periodontology, and a member of the management team of SITOKINE Ltd, a London based genetics company focused on prevention of major cardiovascular disease events and certain types of cancer.

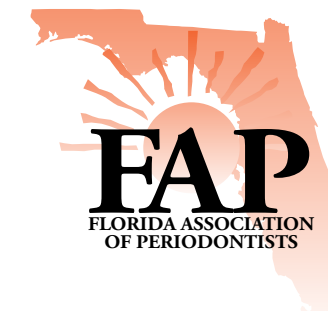
He was previously the Chairman of Periodontics and Professor of Microbiology at University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. His research focuses on genetics of chronic inflammatory diseases as it relates to predisposition and treatment. He has published more than 150 original manuscripts, including papers in Science, The New England Journal of Medicine, Journal of the American College of Cardiology, Human Molecular Genetics, and numerous papers in the periodontal journals.

Dr. Kornman, together with Maurizio Tonetti and Henry Greenwell, authored the World Workshop paper on classification of periodontitis published in Journal of Periodontology 2018.

His mentors were Harald Loe, Sig Ramfjord, and Walter Loesche.

Dr. Kenneth Kornman – The New Classification of Periodontitis:

Why Are We Changing, and How Do I Get Started with the New Classification?

10:00am-12:00pm 2 CEUs

The future of periodontics is primarily about managing clinically and biologically complex patients, which constitute at least 20 to 25% of our adult population. Based on knowledge at the time of the 1999 World Workshop on Classification of Periodontal Diseases, experts in the field described an approach for classifying periodontitis based almost entirely on past severity of disease. In the two decades since the 1999 Workshop, substantial new evidence and new understandings of these diseases have emerged that indicate some of the population develops more severe clinical expression of periodontitis. Evidence supports an interaction of multiple risk factors that translates periodontitis in some of our patients into severe disease with greater complexity of clinical management.

The new periodontitis classification acknowledges the importance of more than disease severity to best guide prevention and treatment of periodontal disease in our patients. Achievement of long-term oral and systemic health outcomes in the complex cases require specialty-level diagnostic and surgical skills, informed by deep knowledge and concepts defined in the 2018 reclassification of periodontitis and the new classification of peri-implant diseases and conditions.

This presentation will describe the rationale for why our periodontitis classification system needed to change, and how to identify patients who present with complex cases. By definition, each complex case must be defined at the individual patient level, and the treatment planning inherently involves precision management of the individual patient. Importantly, the new periodontics should define a new role for the periodontist in the dental and medical care systems of today and the future.
