Essential Principles for Procedural Sedation

Description: The essentials for the safe and effective use of moderate sedation include medical evaluation, pharmacological principles, patient monitoring and team knowledge in recognition and management of sedation-related complications. These essentials will be reviewed, and their significance illustrated using case studies.

Challenges in the Anterior Esthetic Zone: Implants, Teeth & Gingiva

Morning Session: Implants

Although advances in implant esthetic dentistry have been continuing to develop, complications still occur. Esthetic compromise including pink porcelain, prosthetic misfit, unesthetic restorations and patient dissatisfaction are a daily occurrence. The result of poor implant treatment planning can be mechanical failure and/or biologic failure ultimately resulting in financial failure. This course will review proper placement protocols and strategies for when ideal placement is not an option.

Educational Objectives:

- Discuss proper 3-dimensional implant placement.
- Discuss the compromise made when ideal placement is not an option.
- Discuss how to surgically replace compromised implants in the esthetic zone.

Afternoon Session: Teeth and Gingiva

Ideal outcomes in the anterior esthetic zone often requires tissue grafting to complement cosmetic restorative dentistry. Invasive grafting with traditional surgical techniques and materials can often lead to recession and esthetic defects. Advances in biomaterial and non-invasive surgery has given the clinician the ability to predictably augment deficiencies while not creating esthetic problems. This course has an aim to teach the participant atraumatic extraction, minimally invasive hard and soft tissue grafting, and review the latest biologic materials available.

Educational Objectives:

- Learn techniques to carefully remove teeth.
- Learn the available non-invasive surgical hard and soft tissue techniques.
- Discuss bio-promotive material available.
