President's Message

Dear Colleagues,

I recently received a text from my 47-year old niece, who lives several hours away from me. It read, "I just had CO2 on my



gums the other day." Upon further inquiry, she said she was in her fourth week of localized antibiotic therapy by her general dentist for treatment of a localized reactive gingival lesion. There was no definitive diagnosis, as no biopsy had been performed and he had not referred her to a Periodontal specialist. Her periodontal health has been under the control of her general dentist for greater than ten years and she expressed great confidence in his care.

Today, a growing number of General Dentists are treating periodontal disease, both acute and chronic, in their offices and referring their patients to the Periodontist only when all else fails. All too often, Periodontists are invited to join the patient's Dental Team when years of non-surgical maintenance therapy can no longer hide the fact that natural teeth are in danger of being lost and the patient is not okay with it. In these instances, the General Dentist, and even their dental hygienist, act as Gate Keepers, deciding who would benefit from a thorough Periodontal Evaluation by an expert, and when. There is another less-traveled path for patient referrals that can offer the public an alternate route for accessing and achieving the highest levels of periodontal health. That path involves developing a deep and meaningful relationship with the Medical Specialists in our communities.

I am suggesting that Periodontists forge a new Team, paired with Medical Specialists including Cardiologists, Endocrinologists, Rheumatologists, OB-GYN, Orthopedic

Surgeons and others. Our literature is replete with examples of the association between chronic medical conditions and chronic periodontal disease. Using a Medical-Dental Team approach, a thorough periodontal examination would be performed as part of the Medical Patient Examination, with the results entered in the patient's medical record. The Periodontist can then be made aware of the extent and severity of the patient's medical condition including, but not limited to, active therapies for Osteoporosis, Diabetes, Cardiovascular disease, Metabolic Syndrome, Alzheimer's disease and Autoimmune diseases, on a routine basis. The Medical Specialist would be updated periodically of the patient's ongoing periodontal diagnosis and status. Developing this professional team approach may at first be viewed as difficult, but lunch, dinner, golf, attending professional meetings, sharing ideas and making new acquaintances are not activities mutually exclusive to either group.

The following is an example of how the Medical Specialist and the Periodontist can work together for the good of the The Periodontist would provide multiple copies of the Periodontal Clearance Letter (PCL, included as an insert in this newsletter), tailored to the Medical Specialty office, and delivered during a prescheduled business meeting. They should also include a short, current literature review specifically targeting that Specialty and its relationship to Periodontal disease. (Note: The PCL should be personalized using your own letterhead and the physician's name and contact information should be provided at the bottom of the letter.) The object of this letter is for the Medical Specialist to be advised of the patient's suitability for surgery, based on the state of their current periodontal and dental health. This examination would also provide the patient with their periodontal diagnosis, including treatment recommendations. For those of you who already have established relationships with Medical Specialists in your area, our membership would be interested to learn how this is impacting your practice. Management of Medical and Airway Emergencies In The Dental Office

This half day course will provide didactic, video, and case-based hands-on skills labs dealing with medical and airway emergencies possible in the dental and sedation settings. Participants will review, practice, and demonstrate proficiency in managing emergencies including but not limited to respiratory distress and failure, using bag mask, oral and nasal airways, perilaryngeal devices, as well as intubation and cricothyrotomy. Recognizing and treating emergencies such as cardiac events, stroke, syncope, seizures, allergic reactions and laryngospasm will be reviewed and practiced.

This course meets the Florida standard by discussing monitoring and recognition of airway and respiratory emergencies in the dental setting then utilizing standard airway equipment. Through the use of video, slides, case reviews, and hands-on skills labs, participants will review the anatomy of the airway and the physiology of adequate ventilations followed by skills labs in basic and advanced procedures including:

- Bag Valve Device
- Oral and Nasal Airways
- Perilaryngeal Devices
- Intubation Techniques
- Emergency Pharmacology
- Emergency Cricothyrotomy



Dr. John Russo is a graduate of The Ohio State University College of Dentistry. He completed his periodontal training and earned a Master in Health Sciences degree from the Medical University of South Carolina. He has been in private practice in Sarasota, Florida for over thirty years and is a clinical assistant professor at the Medical University of South Carolina in the Division of Periodontics. He is the director of Russo Seminars offering continuing dental education in Sarasota, Florida. Dr. Russo is also a Past President of the Southern Academy of Periodontology and completed two terms, serving six years, on the Board of Trustees for the American Academy of Periodontology.

Dr. Irina Dragan is a Diplomate and Examiner of the American Board of Periodontology. She received her first dental degree (DDS) from Carol Davila University in Romania. She then received her certificate in Periodontology, Master of Science (MS) and Doctor of Dental Medicine (DMD) degrees from Tufts University School of Dental Medicine (TUSDM). She also completed an advanced education program at New York University College of Dentistry in Comprehensive Dentistry with a concentration in esthetic dentistry.

She has published more than 30 papers, authored chapters in textbooks and, is one of the editors of the "Newman and Carranza's Essentials of Clinical Periodontology: An Integrated Study Companion". Shaun Fix has been practicing and teaching in the hospital and pre-hospital field since 1983. He is the president of Emergency Medical Consultants, Inc. and served 35 years as a company officer in charge of Emergency Medicine for Boca Raton Fire Rescue Services in the Palm Beach area of South Florida.

His team has been presenting Management of Office Emergencies for Dental Professionals since the 90's and along with Dental Specialty ACLS courses, helped present the original curriculum for the Dental Airway Course with members of the FSOMS board. He has presented at FSOMS, FAP, and Florida Dental board conferences.

Shaun has presented programs at State, National, and International Conferences and has appeared on FETN, Pulse, 24-7 EMS, Medic Monthly, and Emergency Medical Update videos. A frequent lecturer, author and consultant, Shaun and his group are best known for keeping their programs upbeat and relevant while bringing "the reality of emergency medicine" to the classroom setting and providing onsite relevant training based on the provider's specific needs.

Florida Board of Dentistry Report

Submitted by Dr. Roger Robinson, FAP Immediate Past President

The Board of Dentistry met on Friday, May 19, 2023 in Jacksonville, Florida. All Board members were present with the exception of Drs. Jose Mellado and Bradley Cherry.

There were eight disciplinary proceedings, one dismissed until the next Board meeting. There was one voluntary relinquishment of a dental license, two petition for variance or waiver of rule, and one petition for declaratory statement.

Ms. Sapp, BOD Executive Director, reported on the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) training requirement and provided a legislative update.

The BOD approved rule revisions to Rule 64B5-7.006 Non-Profit Corporation Permits and also Rule 64B5-17.002 Written Dental Records: Minimum Content; Retention:

(1) Dental Record: The dental record shall contain sufficient information to record each patient/dentist in person encounter, identify the patient, support the diagnosis, identify and justify the treatment, and document the course and results of treatment accurately, by including, at a minimum, patient histories; X-rays (if taken); examination results; test results; records of

drugs prescribed, dispensed, or administered; reports of consultation or referrals; identification of all treatments and procedures performed and when they were performed; and copies of records or reports or other documentation obtained from health care practitioners at the request of the dentist and relied upon by the dentist in determining the appropriate treatment of the patient.

In addition, the BOD approved modifications to Rule 64B5-16.0061, Delegation of Remediable Restorative Functions to Dental Hygienists; Supervision Level; and Training and Experience Requirements.

Mr. Ron Dilworth provided the Board with an overview of the dental sedation program. He reported there were 681 inspections completed last fiscal year and 222 inspections have been completed so far this year.

AAP District III Trustee Report

Submitted by: Drs. Cecil White, Jr. and Walter Colón, II, AAP District III Trustees

The Board of Trustees met May 12-13, 2023, in Jackson, Wyoming.

Viability - The Board approved the 2024 Strategic Plan. Highlights include enhanced efforts to increase membership engagement, opportunities to engage with at-risk member segments, the addition of activities to more closely monitor sedation guidelines, ongoing implementation of the multi-year science strategy, and continued nurturing of the leadership pipeline.

Leadership - The Board approved the selection of awardees for the 2023 Gold Medal, Master Clinician, Distinguished Service, Honorary Membership, and H. Dalton Conner Humanitarian awards. In addition, the Board approved a nominee for the ADA Norton M. Ross Award for Excellence in Clinical Research and ranked finalists of the ADEA William J. Gies Award. Proposed appointments to the 2023-2024 In-Service Examination Committee were also approved.

Education - The Board approved additional speakers, moderators, and courses for the 2023 Annual Meeting Program as well as the proposed 2024 Annual Meeting CE Program. In addition, the Board approved the creation of two CEOC subcommittees: the Online Learning Subcommittee and the Dental Hygiene Subcommittee.

Membership - The Board approved the Membership Recruitment and Rewards Program pilot program and the sunsetting of the PerioHub community on the AAP Connect Member Community.

Science - The Board approved collaborating with AO on the "Prevention and Management of Peri-Implant Diseases" to be held in August 2024. The Task Force on Future Science is in the process of finalizing the specifics of the collaboration, including AAP participants.

The Board agreed to support the American Society of Dentist Anesthesiologists and American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons Model State Sedation/General Anesthesia Rules. Additionally, the Board empowered Dr. Okano and/or Ms. Erin O'Donnell Dotzler to reach out to the American Society of Dentist Anesthesiologists regarding the possibility of including the American Academy of Periodontology in the name of the model rules.

The 2023 Annual Meeting will take place November 9-12 in Austin. Members can review the program, register, and secure housing at am2023.perio.org. Preliminary program coming soon!

Through generous support from some of the AAP's partners, scholarships are available for AAP Student Members and periodontists new to practice to help them attend the 109th Annual Meeting. Each scholarship includes admission to the Student and New Periodontist session on Friday, November 10th. AAP Dental Hygiene Engagement Initiative - Work on the Dental Hygiene Engagement Initiative continues. The multifaceted initiative includes a variety of tactics designed to educate and engage with the hygienist audience. The AAP will host a session at the upcoming ADHA meeting in June and promotion of the Dental Hygiene Symposium at the 2023 Annual Meeting will commence soon. A major component of the Dental Hygiene Engagement Initiative is the AAP Dental Hygiene Study Club Program. The program will offer professionally produced content to help AAP members facilitate a dental hygiene study club in their local areas. Members who sign up will gain access to pre-recorded video modules, template materials, tips and tricks, and more! To incentivize dental hygienists to participate in an AAP memberled dental hygiene study club, hygienists who participate can sign up to be part of the AAP Dental Hygienist Recognition Program to earn CE and receive credit towards different tiers of AAP recognition.
